Nature & Sights

- **Kirkjufell and Kirkjufellsfoss:** Iceland's most photographed mountain and waterfall.
 - Shuttle bus available every 30 minutes whil cruise ships are in port.
- Grundarfoss: A majestic waterfall standing 70 meters tall (230 feet).
- **Grundarfjörður Church:** A beautiful local church featuring stained glass windows.
- **Grundarfjörður harbour:** A vibrant harbor with fishing vessels, cruise ships, and small boats.



Tours & Activities

- **Local swimming pool**: Relax in a warm hot tub and enjoy stunning mountain views.
- **Grundarfjörður golf course:** A scenic 9-hole golf course overlooking the bay, just 10 minutes drive from town.
- **Frisbee golf:** Try your hand at frisbee golf on a 9-hole course located next to the swimming pool
- Klifurfell: Indoor climbing gym for all skill levels.
- **Kirkjufell horsecenter:** Meet a friendly herd of Icelandic horses ideal for both beginners and experienced riders.
- **Vestur Adventures:** Explore Mt. Kirkjufell and its surroundings on a sit-on-top kayak.
- **Snæfellsnes Adventure:** Offers private and scheduled tours departing from Grundarfjörður port.
- Snæfellsnes Excursions: Shore excursions from Grundarfjörður.



Shops & Dining

- **Bjargarsteinn**: Cozy, laid-back restaurant with a seasonal menu.
- **Harbour Café**: Serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Dishes include fish, lamb, and chicken.
- **Kaffi 59**: A small, family-owned restaurant located on the main street, Grundargata.
- Mæstro Street food: Food truck offering Icelandic hot dogs and subs.
- **Græna Kompaníið**: A cozy book café with a twist, located in the heart of town. Sells Icelandic yarn and books.
- Valería: High-end Colombian coffee roasted on-site.
- **Blossi**: A charming shop offering Icelandic candy, souvenirs, handicrafts, and more.
- Prjónað á plani: Handmade crafts made from Icelandic Lopi yarn.



Arts & Sculptures

- **Liston:** Local artist with a gallery in town and stone sculptures displayed throughout Grundarfjörður.
- **Sýn:** A tribute to the life and work of fishermen, created by renowned sculptor Steinunn Þórarinsdóttir.
- **112 words for wind:** An environmental sculpture by Sólrún Halldórsdóttir, inspired by the many Icelandic words for wind.
- The Orca Sculpture: A life-size model of an orca whale, created by Unnsteinn Guðmundsson.
